Independence Day is upon us: The Fourth of July. It's a day you probably know well and one that you anticipate with pleasure. Here are some interesting facts about the nation's birthday you may not know about. FACT ONE: Americans began observing the Fourth of July as early as 1777, but Congress didn't make it official until 1870, when a bill was passed to establish major state holidays like Christmas, New Year's and Independence Day. FACT TWO: It is the biggest hot dog holiday of the year (around 155 million will be consumed) though the origin of the hot dog is unknown. FACT THREE: Our Founding Fathers celebrated with a meal of turtle soup, New England poached salmon with egg sauce, green peas and boiled new potatoes, followed by Indian pudding or Apple Pandowdy. FACT FOUR: The Liberty Bell has not been rung since 1864, due to worries about it cracking; instead the bell is tapped 13 times signaling for bells across the country to start ringing. FACT FIVE: Two signers of the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.

As you plan to celebrate this Independence Day, gather with family and friends; set off a few fireworks; remember those who have shaped our country and our lives; thank God for being alive to celebrate. It was President Ronald Reagan who said so well, "Let the Fourth of July always be a reminder that here in this land, for the first time, it was decided that humankind is born with certain God-given rights; that government is only a convenience created and managed by the people, with no powers of its own except those voluntarily granted to it by the people." Let us be a beacon of hope to the world!

May 16th Session Meeting Highlights

- Pastor Peter will be moderating Aurora Presbyterian Church Session meetings starting Wednesday 7/15 and as long as it takes to select an Interim Pastor
- Community garden – First Presbyterian Church will provide water for individuals, families and groups who want to plant and maintain a garden plot.
- Pastor Peter will be taking vacation days from July 22nd to August 2 and will be gone two Sundays
- A faith academy for youth started during worship and will be every Sunday. Each week will feature one topic.
- We are working on a new contract with NW Senior & Disability Services which will provide for a 3% raise or \$20 per month. Pastor Peter and Walt will investigate further a proposed wording change from “provider” to “partner.”
- We have obtained new copier lease bids.
- Head start has a list of items to be repaired: water spots on ceiling of office and of a classroom, new carpet in their office, new linoleum and carpet in classrooms.
- On June 16th, one of the Meals volunteers fell through the sliding glass door ended up having stitches – Woodburn radiator and glass will replace the glass. We will be coordinating payment with NW Senior & Disability and our insurance.
- May revenue was \$8,693 and expenses \$10,406 leaving a difference of \$1,713.
- Love Inc. will be at church on Friday & Saturday August 7th and 8th to hand out school supplies from 9 am – 3 pm.
- Rock has been delivered and spread on the south side of the church. The watering system will need a \$1,000 repair before plants can be added.
- Bill Anderson has been cleaning out the gutters.
- We served Konditorei cakes on choir appreciation Sunday and served strawberry shortcake after Pastor Peter’s commissioning on June 14th. We will be having a church picnic at Nancy’s house on a date to be announced later.
- Membership Caring: Johanna continues to provide visiting, calls regulars who aren’t in attendance, and sends out birthday cards.
- Next Meeting Date: July 21, 2015 at 6:00 p.m.
