+Some donations have been received yet for the repair/replacement of the leather bellows in the organ with an estimated cost of \$2358.00 but there has been interest expressed in doing this. +Certificate of Appreciation from Presbytery of the Cascades Board of Trustees for our contribu-

tion to Partnership Giving in 2015

+Letter and promotional "bookmark" regarding volunteering at General Assembly

+Email from Julie Moore stating that Fran Welch, a member of Chapter DT, PEO, requests that they be allowed to use the church kitchen carts during their auction on Saturday, April 30. A motion was passed approving this.

+Financial Review as required by PC(USA): Harley Piper and one other person will be asked to do this.

+Annual Review of Sexual Misconduct Policy: Joanne Hanson will review the policy and make recommendations.

+We need to prepare a new lease, now, with La Iglesia – Puerta del Cielo because Pastor Edy Mendoza is leaving. The current lease runs through June 30, 2016.

+Organ repair savings account: the organ has costly repairs needed every 20 years (that can cost \$30,000), we must save for it. Begin a savings account? Session agreed to doing this and suggested checking whether grants might be available.

+Request for vacation to attend my niece's wedding in Fresno, CA May 15, 2016. Session approved the request, by motion. It was noted that there will also be a substitute organist on May 15.

+Meals on Wheels may not move out. They need our site to prepare meals. They would occupy our building for fewer hours after their new building is done.

Mission: It is now time to start requesting donations for school supplies.

Property: Walt is looking into the cost of a separate irrigation line.

+Pastor Peter is working with Dean to get started on the community garden and is looking for others to get involved.

+The carpet needs to be shampooed and water stains removed.

+Investigation of roof leaks. We need to find someone to caulk flashing.

+An estimate from Mike Bergeron to repair drains outside should be received this week. There are roots in the pipes.

+We need to contact Roth's about heating and cooling problems.

+There are carpenter ants in the building. We need to spray.

+There was discussion about running new wires to the sound system.

Outreach: A representative of Willamette Valley Hospice would come to our church to talk about Advance Directives to people who might be interested in learning more. This may be scheduled for May 22, after the service. +Our newsletter will be uploaded to our website.

Membership Caring: Cards were sent out to Lois Koval and to Bob Anderson.

Worship: Maundy Thursday service was held jointly with the Aurora Presbyterian Church, with a 6:00 p.m. soup supper followed by worship service at 7:00p.m., with 40 people served communion

+On Easter Sunday, we celebrated with a cantata, "The Passion of the Christ" in memory of Patty Burlingham, who directed our choir for 29 years. Communion was served to 61 people.

+For communion on Sunday, May 1, Marcy and Nancy will prepare and serve with Walt and Bill
