PRESBYTERY NEWS

The Presbytery of the Cascades met online on June 23 to conduct business and to celebrate new ministries. These included:

Barbie's Village—A ministry to repurpose the Presbyterian Church of Laurelhurst building by providing affordable housing (tiny homes) and a child care community center for Native American women and children. Named in memory of Barbie, the Native American woman who launched the project but died suddenly.

Roseway Recovery Cafe—Calvary Presbyterian Church on NE Sandy Boulevard remodeled their fellowship hall into a cafe for people who are in recovery, experiencing addiction or mental health challenges or homelessness.

Makers PDX—This is a new church startup, an inclusive worshiping community in SE Portland. They have dinner together once a week and run a coffee shop near Reed College called Heretic Coffee. They are creating a "Makerspace" where artists and creative people work for justice and peace.
