Thanks also to Mark Sterling who served six years consecutively, and to Mike Hachquet who served as Clerk of Session for six years consecutively.



The pictures are of the really young seedlings and starts at our home nursery, those which have been transitioned from the nursery to day care in the garden greenhouse and of the Garlic which has recently had its Winter frost cloth blanket removed and is growing taller and stronger by the day. We have also had some Collards and Chard which survived the winter cold and are off and growing. Varieties (so far) include Napa Cabbage, Broccoli, Cauliflower, Onions, Tomatoes (cherries and slicers), more Fig trees and Heather is propagating Hydrangeas and Olive Trees, from cuttings. The Marion – Polk Food Bank will be supplementing this list with their annual plant start giveaways scheduled in April, May, and June, too.
